

# LASHA HIGH POINT AWARDS RULES

(Revised 1/2/2004)

1. Owner of the horse must be a paid member for the calendar year for points to count. In equitation classes, the rider must be a paid member. Dues must be paid prior to the class for points to count and will only count from the date the dues are paid. Membership fees are as follows: Adult Member (18 years and older) \$20.00 ; Junior Member (under the age of 17) \$15.00.
2. Points to count as follows: First -5; Second-4; Third-3; Fourth-2; Fifth-1. Double points will count in championship classes.
3. All Louisiana shows including but not limited to, Dixie Jubilee, LASHA Spring and LASHA Summer, as well as any show sponsored by an individual barn\*\* in this state will count for points. \*\*Individual barn show will count only if the barn has submitted a \$50.00 LASHA barn affiliation fee prior to the show.
4. Show results are compiled by the Secretary, Assistant Secretary and Points Recorder and will be mailed to each trainer quarterly. All points and show results are available for inspection by any member.
5. The horse or rider (equitation only) with the highest total points in each division will be declared the winner each year. Reserve ribbons will be awarded to the second highest score in the youth division classes only, unless otherwise determined by the LASHA officers and/or the board of directors.
6. Smaller shows which might not offer each of our point classes in each division will be handled as follows: the points will be collected on each horse as they placed within the class they participated in and then credit will be given in the proper LASHA division. Example: In a show that offers only an Open English Pleasure Class where both adults and youths are competing together, both will be given points in their respective LASHA divisions.
7. The horse competing must be entered under its full registered name and under the name of the owner of record with the **American Saddlebred Horse Association**. A certificate of eligibility to show, officially recorded with the ASHA will be accepted in lieu of the entry being shown under the name of the recorded owner. Example: Academy classes and other than Saddlebred horse classes.
8. In order for any entry to receive points, it must have worked both ways of the ring and been judged. Any horse that is excused from the ring before being judged is not eligible for points.
